**Salon workers were helped for their livelihood first time in the district**

War affected salon workers of 28 persons from Trincomalee were assisted with Salon chairs and Salon equipments, and they were able to generate their income without capital investments.



### **HRDO Clients started their livelihoods**

Livelihood assistances such as goats, Sewing machines, Poultry, Grocery shop items, etc.were provided to 21 war affected families of Trincomalee. By providing livelihood these families are able to generate their income, and were able to market their products.



### **Mutur resettled families received livelihood inputs**

181 War affected resettled families from Pallikudrippu of Muthur were given Livelihood assistances such as Mamoties and axes, to clean up their dwelling places which had been neglected for a long period of time. By providing the farming equipments they were able to do Home Gardening and sell their products.

### **Completed hardware repairing training for 30 school leavers**

We have provided Livelihood assistance (Computer Hardware training programme) for 30 students whom we have already given the training at Jaffna Zonal Education department with the assistance of Non formal Education Unit-



of Jaffna Zonal Education department. The certification and tools handing over was held on 26<sup>th</sup> September 2008 at the department of education. Head of non formal- Northern province and director of education participated at the programme.



### **From beneficiary's heart....**

I, Vimalathas Sarmila, of 25, cemetery road, Navanthurai lost my husband Mr. Winson Vimalathas who accompanied Fr. Jim Brown in 2006 when the situation was very unusual. People all know that both of them disappeared. This was an unforgettable event. After sometime we heard that they have been dead. I was left alone with my 5 children without any help to lead my life. I did not have any self employment to generate my income. I was in a difficult situation.



At that time I approached CHA, and related my story. They carefully listened to me and identified me as a deserving case. They provided me with necessary things and materials worth of Rs. 20,000/- to put up a small grocery shop. I have started the shop and I am able to get some income for my children's' studies, and to lead my life. Children also are helping me to manage the shop. There also were assisted by CHA to continue their education.

When I was in a difficult situation, CHA came forward to help me. This timely help gave me courage and confidence to do a business very successfully. I assure you that I will continue my business for the development of my family

### **Vocational Training center at Erukkalampiddy resettlement village, Nagawilluwa, Palavi**

The village comprising of 1015 persons having been struggling without a proper building in order to develop their village and conduct trainings, development meetings, etc. As they've been using the preschool earlier, now the building is considered as an invaluable asset to develop the community.

During the day time the women in the camp come for training to the center conducted by a resource person hired by us from the National craft council. Each time a new item is teach they make their own products and sends it to the market. All their products are made out of different parts of the coconut tree so finding material is no big issue for them.

At the moment there are over 30 women who are undergoing the training programme.





The recently displaced people from Ampara, Trincomalee, Vavuniya, Batticaloa and Jaffna war affected areas and temporarily live at

Akkraipattu and Alayadevembu DS Division couldn't recommence their livelihood activity due to absence of equipments and tools.



Provision of livelihood materials such as carpentry, mason, saloon, agriculture, retail shops, snack food preparation, poultry, wiring and animal husbandry tools and equipment help them to restart their livelihood activity or start

a new livelihood option.



In addition 11 poor widow families were selected for self employment programme. All 11 beneficiaries linked with CHA livelihood forum and convene meeting once a month to share knowledge, skills, problems and market opportunities among them.

At the same time, CHA facilitated on the job training to the beneficiaries by collaborating with appropriate prog conducted by government and NGOs. Their main livelihood activities are flour grinding, making snack food, poultry and tailoring.



Then 104 youth from Vinyagapuram selected and initiated Small Business Working Groups in the area of food production and marketing products with the aim to strengthen community livelihood skills and offer employment opportunities for the unemployed youth (mostly females).



Each Business group trained on food processing (depend on category of Business Group), Starting Your Business

(SYB), Marketing management and Quality control and Improving Your Business (IYB) by relevant institutions and expertise before commencement of livelihood activities. The processed products are marketed through the local shops and mobile sales persons.

### Development and Expansion of Home gardening



30 families, engage in home gardening were selected to develop and expand the existing home garden system.

Department of Agriculture train and appraise the beneficiaries on ecological farming, control of pest and diseases and techniques to improve the production in a sustainable way.

### Establishment of Sewing Training and Tailoring Centre



20 women were trained in making kids, ladies and gents' cloths, embroidery work, patch work and etc. CHA provided 10 machines and required accessories to

start marketing while on training.

### Gingelly Processing Centre at Cheddikulam

The programme is carried out in collaboration with Department of Agriculture, Divisional Secretariat, Cheddikulam. The selected twenty women trained in production of Gingelly oil and by products such as sweets and Poonac. An experienced Gingelly Oil

Processor trained the twenty women. The Department of Agriculture continuously assists to improve the quality and market of the products.

**Relief at Eachchilampattu**

RR unit had covered 2950 families to provide relief assistance. Resettled families were provided with vegetables, Rice, and Tin Fish. That was help full to them till they find own income to manage their basic needs

Echilampatru experienced the first problem with civil war then faced the tsunami and finally been destroyed by the war took place in 2006 where total area was destroyed and all the people had to displace for their sake of life.



RR unit had covered 50 families to provide relief assistance at Puttur. Resettle village people requested Kopay DS to make a road for their village; it was in bad condition and could not be used during the rainy season. Families also were suffering for food since they didn't have any work. So this project was implemented through divisional secretariat and the Resettled families were provided with Rice, Floor, Sugar, Dhal, Tea, Soap and Tin Fish for their participation in the "Food for Work" programme. That was helpful to them until they find their own income to manage their basic needs and to get a path to their village.

**Assistance for prisoners**

Jaffna relief and rehabilitation unit provided NFRI, Clothes, sanitation materials and books to the Jaffna prison for the people who have surrendered for their safety. Young students and youths had surrendered due to the fear of violence. They seek the protection at Human Right commission. Since they had drop out the



school, they were assisted by providing needed Moreover we have dug two tube- wells and built three toilets in the prison.

**500 families received NFRI pack**

CHA have provided NFRI to 500 IDP Families in Kopay, Uduvil, Tellippalai, Sandilipay and Chankanai. The following beneficiaries were identified by the Government Agent for this programme.

### Education for Echchilampattu resettled students

Resettled students were assisted for education, continuously for 8 months by the appointment of volunteer teachers at Sri Seshanbaga M.V. Eachchilampattu. There are around 300 students get the benefits through this.



### 349 Students received educational materials for one year

The 349 IDP's students were provided with the necessary school requirements such as Students stationery items, and school bags. By CHA providing these assistances the school students were going to school regularly and their education had improved

### Jinnanagar Pre School needs for 30 Students

Resettled Pre school children of 30 numbers were assisted with Pre school furniture, Drinking water filter, and Pre School kids necessities. The Kids were happy to attend the Pre School. Parents also were motivated to send their kids to the Pre School regularly

### 100 students completed ICT education

100 students who have sat for the G.C.E.A/L were been trained in ICT and English course. These 100 IDP's students with their parents had been displaced during the conflict, and later resettled in their own areas. Knowledge of computer and English had benefited them for their future. The programme was held at 4 different locations Nilaveli, Thampalagamam, and Town & Gravets areas in Trincomale



### **Awareness on Education reached more than 45000 students and parents**

It was observed the interest on education and last OL and AL results shows put achievement among Jaffna students than last years.

Started the awareness programme through mini film series “to promote total quality development among school students” by Zonal Director of Education – Jaffna. The short film production as an awareness tool is completed for 45000 students and parents.

Awareness activities were held at 20 locations.

School teachers and in-service advisers also participated on production of the awareness documentary and awareness arrangements.



### **ICT Education for students**

It was successfully completed ICT education over 200 students in Jaffna district with the support of education department. The programme was designed to promote the existing centre to deliver the ICT programme more efficiently with sustainable progress. Centre still continues its programme with more students. Students were selected from schools and Children’s Homes.



### **Upgraded three primary schools at Navithanveli, Kalmunai**

The three primary schools in Navithanveli DS Division; STR/ Namagal Vidyalayam, STR/ Kannagi Vidyalayam and STR/ Sanmuka Vidyalayam were started on 01-01-2007

with very limited resource. New class room building, black boards and furniture were provided to these three schools.



### Improved the learning resources of preschools at Uhana

The Kumudu Preschool- Tissapura, and Nayodaya Preschool- Gonagala (very remote villages) will be given with playing and educational materials to improve learning and playing resources available to children.



### **Improving the learning facilities to Children**



The above schools are located at IDP villages and lack physical infrastructure facilities resulted in insufficient class room space and loss of study time in unfavourable weather conditions.

Construction of three new class room buildings, repairing of roof and provision of library furniture and books resulted in

- Better quality education and infrastructure facilities for children
- Children have a better human environment at school
- Improvement of teaching facilities in schools
- Improved student reading habit, self learning capacity and information sharing skills.

## Nutrition Program

Selected schools belonging to the displaced community were selected for this purpose whereby a meal a day for children in the preschool were provided comprising of a bun and a milk pack for 3 months period

### **38 orphan Children received toilet facilities**

War affected orphan children Construction of Four Toilets to the 38 war affected orphans of Trincomalee were helpful as they were able to go to school in time, and the Hygiene standards had become better.



### **50 elders helped for Cataract surgery**

Surgery for 50 Cataract patients of the war affected families from Trincomalee, were benefited because they were displaced families and they did not have the financial needs to do it elsewhere. The surgery helped these patients to get a better vision.



### **6 toilets provided to war affected families**

Toilet construction is completed at Trincomalee and Kinniya D.S Divisions. 6 selected families who were recommended by the Divisional secretariat as relevant families for this assistant.

It was observed that the health conditions among these families are increased after this programme. They said that it helped a lot to protect their children from the infections which is a common problem in this area.



### **Mobile health clinic for mutur IDPs**

Mobile health clinic was arranged with the collaboration of lion's club in mutur. 284 Spectacles were donated for the People with poor eye sight. 14 diabetic and 19 hypertension patients were detected and advised to take treatment continuously at the Muthur hospital. 424 patients underwent for sight screening. Of these 28 Cataract patients were detected. 42

Dental patients were treated at the same day by the Dental Surgeons.



### **130 school Principals were trained on Psychosocial**



No of children identified with, psychological problems due to the war in Jaffna.

Therefore Psychosocial training programme for selected 130 School principals in Jaffna District

have been completed and all participants really appreciated the training given.

Another Psychosocial programme was arranged for trainee school teachers in Jaffna. This programme is being facilitated through RDHS and Jaffna psychosocial forum. 4 days training programme will be done for 4 batchers of 160 teachers

**Enhancing the Ability of disable and Special needs children**

It was completed the “Enhancing the Ability of Disable and Special needs children in Healthy life and Educational Activities” Program for 120 children and their parents at Jaffna Zonal Education Department training hall with the assistance of the Jaffna Zonal Education Department.

Children with special needs also were provided materials such as wheel chair and spectacles to continue their studies more efficiently



**Construction of a Maternity clinic building at the Nawagathegama Rural Hospital**

Nawagathegama being a rural village in the Puttlam District, the hospital consists of very basic facilities. At present the doctor’s rest room is converted into the clinic room where the clinic for pregnant mother and the vaccination for infants are taking place. The mothers and children that comes in hundreds to the clinic which is conducted twice a week have to stand out side the room for hours to obtain any treatment. The mothers suffer in their condition to stand for hours.

Our objective was to assist these people with a clinic building where there will be adequate facilities to sit and wait for their turn while there will be separate clinic rooms for both pregnant mothers and infants with toilet and other basic necessary facilities.

The hospital construction was completed, for a low cost due to the community support provided in labor, bricks and sand. Now pregnant mother have got decent facilities at the clinic.



Other than that the path way to the mortuary was done as it is located away from the hospital , the staff had to carry remains as they cannot take trolleys .



### **Providing medical assistance / treatments families living in IDP camps**

28 Mobile camps were conducted during the period 1<sup>st</sup> December 2007 to 14<sup>th</sup> April 2008 which included diabetics screening and dental screening. Areas covered during the these camps were from Udappu to Eluwankulam and most of the IDP camps in Kulpitiya road and suburbs.

**10,003** patients were treated in the Out patient section. All patients who are over 40 years were informed to come after 12 hours fasting and over 1000 were investigated for diabetics. Urine and blood samples were collected for investigation and individual reports and investigations were provided to the patients.

Through the dental clinics it was observed that general dental care is poor among the school going children. It was identified that all school going children need at least one dental check up in every three months.

It was also observed that most of the children at these camp locations had unsatisfactory hygiene conditions. Villagers like Poonapitiya, Eluwankulama, IDp camps such as New Sydney, Salamabath and Mujahideempuram has no dispensary, hospital or Pharmacy to get their medicine. They have to travel a long way even to get a basic pain killer. So these camps were greatly appreciated by the beneficiaries.

Dusty and unhygienic surrounding in the IDP camps caused many skin related diseases and asthmatic problems. On completion of 28 health camps conducted with the assistance of Kuwait Hospital the following were identified as the common diseases and were provided with necessary treatments. Skin Rashes ,Hypertention and Diabetic ,Arthritis

### **To provide water facilities for 97 families in Mannar Mawthe Camp , Nurachcholai**

This camp consists of 86 Muslim and 6 Sinhalese families displaced from Mannar in 1990. The over head tank which would have the capacity to store sufficient amount of water for all the families was constructed.



### Nutritional packs to pregnant and lactating mothers



153 ANC mothers in Aligambae, Kannakipuram and Panankadu were provided with nutritional packs with the aim to improve their body nutritional level to a certain level. Each pack consists of cereals, pulses, processed fish foods, oils and milk powder.



15'' LG Colour TV was handed over to the Children Ward, Akkaraipattu Base Hospital. Provision of TV gives an entertainment for children at ward.

### Ultra Sound Abdomen machine to MOH office - Alayadevembu

Alayadevembu MOH office did not have a Ultra sound scanner to check the pregnant mothers. If, the patients are to be scanned, they have to go to Akkaraipattu Base Hospital, which is about 30kms from their villages. Due to lack of transport facility and high bus fare, most of the pregnant mothers do not perform scanning. This resulted many undesirable effects.

After provision of scanner machine to Alayadevembu MOH office has been utilized by Akkaraipattu District Hospital also. Now the pregnant mothers in Alayadevembu and Akkaraipattu MOH area have the facility to do scanning during the clinics.

### Mobile Medical Clinic at Cheddikulam



A mobile medical camp was conducted at Cheddikulam District Hospital with the support of SLRC, Vavuniya targeting 20 Grama Niladari Divisions in Vengalcheddikulam DS, Division. But people from

32 near by villages attended the clinic and more than 1200 patients benefited. A team of Consultants, physicians, nurse pharmacists and volunteers supported to conduct the clinic successfully. Due to more crowds, around 300 people couldn't be assisted. It's considered to have another clinic during the next month.

### Children Park at MOH Office, Vavuniya



Daily about 300 outpatients visit the MOH office, Vavuniya (Child and Mental Health unit). But the MOH office doesn't have enough facilities to accommodate the outpatients. The outpatients normally stand

at the open land in front of the MOH office, nearly about four hours to get the treatment. As a result the pregnant mothers and children face many difficulties.

To minimize the problems face by children and mothers, a children park has been established in front of MOH office as well as a small boutique also put up within the premises to sell healthy hygienic food items.

### **Completed construction of new houses**

These five new houses had been built to the families who had been affected by the Civil War, in Muthur, Morawewa, Kinniya, and Trincomalee D.S. Divisions. The houses had been built on the recommendations of the G.N and the D.S. of the particular divisions, and had been constructed according to the B.O.Q. approved by the Technical Officer. These houses had been constructed on the support provided by CHA.



### **Completed renovation of 20 shelter**

The shelter project on the partly damaged houses of Konesapuri is completed. 20 houses are renovated at the Konesapuri area and which are ready to occupy by the IDPs who are relocated in another area since these houses were not in condition to live.



Saltern II camp situated 5km from Puttlam town, was initiated between 1990 and 1993 consisting of 186 families who were expelled forcibly from Jaffna peninsula where they were born in a short notice of 2 hours and in some places 2 days. People were sent on their way towards no land, forbidden from carrying any materials, cash or valuable except for small items, drink, food clothes sufficient for a day or two. After they reached Puttlam, the government allocated them temporary huts amidst huge difficulties. Initially 186 families settled down in this camp.

In 1993 April the camp was faced with yet another disaster of a huge fire accident which burnt all 186 huts in a matter of 20 minutes. Scourging one life and destroying chicken and cattle which the people had as their only source of dependency were totally destroyed leaving no trace except ashes. Following this incident the particular camp was split into 3 namely Saltern I, Saltern II and Pasparabath.

Following this incident Saltern II (project location) was consisted with a number of 31 families. In 1998 also a storm hit the camp and most of the houses were completely or partially destroyed. Even though the people found no proper way to rebuild their houses occasionally due to extreme poverty condition they eke out a minimal way of finding their daily needs through doing labor work and odd jobs.

This camp was recommended by the Puttlam district Government Agent and the Commissioner for the Internally displaced in Puttlam. After obtaining their approval steps were taken to get clearance of the ownership of the land. As there is a housing project been conducted by the World Bank we made sure not to create conflict among the beneficiaries. In this regard we met with the officials of the World Bank to adopt the same plan of the house which have been approved by the government.

After obtaining all necessary approvals our beneficiary list came up to 28 new houses and 3 renovations. BOQ's were called and the most suitable contractor was selected by a team of members at the head office. On selection a contract were drawn between CHA and the contractor.

The constructions were completed by August 2008 and houses were handed over to the beneficiaries as and when a unit was completed. This was need as they were moved out into sheds while the constructions were going on. Every body was very happy to get a new house with all basic facilities. Some have lived in this shed for over fifteen years.



### Upgraded temporary shelters



The existing temporary shelter structure was upgraded by putting raised cement floor instead of sand floor and tin sheets for roof to protect the lives from extreme weather conditions.

61 temporary shelters located at Navatkadu, Alayadevembu, Kolavil-3, Panananakdu and Akkaraipattu camps were upgraded to transitional shelter.

### Permanent housing



Before CHA Assistance

Newly Built House with financial assistance of CHA

Nine conflicts affected marginalized families in Akkaraipattu and Alayadevembu DS division, who did not have proper basic shelter facilities and needed of housing, were assisted to build beneficiary driven permanent houses with all basic amenities.

Uhana- Gonagala Colonization Scheme



These settlers were brought to Gonagala in the year 1954 under the Mahaweli colonization scheme and colonized in the boarder area. Their major problem is their economy. They were not in a position to construct a permanent house of their own, with their meager income.

When beneficiaries received permanent housing with assistance of CHA, the beneficiaries are very happy. These new houses have provided them a permanent roof over their heads, for which they are thankful to CHA.

About 95% of the houses present at Ghandinagar were partially built houses with out proper ventilation, living space and protection. Therefore the objective of shelter renovation work at Ghandinagar was to improve housing facility with adequate ventilation, living space and protection. Thus main components of renovation work are plastering, fixing of doors and windows and flooring based on the existing housing structure. It is worthwhile mentioning, the houses were being renovated considering beneficiaries' requirement as well as meet the basic standards of housing facility.

After completion of renovation, the beneficiaries built kitchens, white washed and cleaning home garden and surroundings.

We conducted the mobile clinic successfully in Jaffna and over 895 families benefited. The first programme was held at Chankanai on the 31st of March This is under J/178 & J/180 GS division & Chankanai AGA division, which includes Amythi IDP camp, Kapanda IDP camp, Thoppu IDP camp, Pothakar IDP camp, Odakarai IDP camp, Neethavan IDP camp, Salasiur IDP camp & Neethimanram IDP camp. Two hundred & sixty two families (1018 family members) were there. They are displaced from Karainagar & Tellipalai on 1990 & 1992.



The 5th mobile documentation clinic for Jaffna was conducted at chunakam Kannakikudijirupu pre school hall in Uduvil on 29th of May 2008 from 10.30 am – 3.00pm. This is under J/185, J/190 & J/196 GS divisions & Uduvil DS division, which includes Sabapathipillai IDP camp, Kannakikudijiruppu, Inuvil railway station camp, Periyamathavady, Mill Camp, Alady Camp, Maddakachy Camp, Illanthaiyady Camp. Four hundred & ten families (1273 family members) are there. They are displaced from Tellipalai in 1990. More than hundred & fifty people were participated out of this amount 125 were benefited.

The 6th mobile documentation clinic for Jaffna was conducted at Shanrore pre school hall in Navatkuli National housing scheme. On 1st of July 2008 from 9.00 am – 2.00pm. This is under J/294 & J/295 GS divisions & Chavakacheri DS division. Two hundred & eighty families are there. They are displaced from Jaffna coastal areas in 1990. 90 peoples were benefited. Six officers & two volunteers participated at the documentation clinic. There are district registry, ADL, Lawyer, PMA & Grama Niladharies (J/294) & (J/295). On behalf of CHA myself, Mr. Rathakirishnan & Mr. Baskaran were participated.

### **Providing knowledge in obtaining legal documentation for school children.**

100 Tamil Medium & 100 Sinhala Medium School Students from Puttlam Education Zonal benefited from this program representing 50 Tamil and 50 Sinhala schools. Program was conducted on 29.04.2008 and 30.04.2008 respectively. The program included on obtaining Birth Certificate (BC), Death Certificate (DC), Marriage Certificate (MC) and National Identity Card if a person has lost it for persons who don't have it at all. The resource persons were Mr.Kunjan Asst. Registrar General, Puttlam and Mr.P.Razeek, Administrative Officer for Grama Naladaris, Puttlam AG division.

The coordination of the program was done through the District Secretariat of Puttlam, Divisional Secretariat of Puttlam and Department of Education Puttlam.



### **Legal Documentation Awareness Program**

The programme was for 55 female students of this Ladies Arabic College took part in the program. The program included topics related to obtaining Birth Certificate (BC), Death Certificate (DC), Marriage Certificate (MC) and National Identity card documents
