The costs for 20 buses and 30 tractors from the 10th to the 19th of Jan. Concern was expressed about the lack of land which is proving a significant hurdle for progress in both transitional shelter and permanent housing. (2) CARE discussed potential income generating activities with community leaders and CBOs in Koddady, Urani, and Munai villages. (3) CARE also conducted a health needs assessment in Sandilipai and Point Pedro DS divisions where people expressed a need for a primary health care center. (4) CARE has been conducting a shelter needs assessment. A special concern was raised about people who have been displaced several times – initially from the high security zones, and then later from the tsunami. Their situation is more complicated because some already own land outside of the restricted coastal conservation zone that they were not living on because of their initial displacement. • CARE has been coordinating Cash for Work in six villages. The two subgroups participated in by SLRCS is games and songs.</p> <p>School-based Psychosocial and Health project:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The 4th Monthly meeting for the 1st phase teachers was conducted on the 2nd and 3rd of April. On the 2nd of April 30 teachers and 6 volunteers participated and on the 3rd of April 36 teachers and 6 volunteers participated. The missing participants on day 1 of the workshops were mainly from J / Navatkuli Maha Vid. The absence was discussed with the teachers, when they appeared during the second day. Individual reasons were given from each of the teachers, such as sudden hospitalisation of family members etc. The importance of them participating in each training was stressed to each of the teachers as well as the group as a whole. A problem has arisen in J / Myilliddy North Kalaimagal Vid. in regards to the number of teachers participating in the programme. Transfer of the original teachers volunteering for the programme, pregnancy of one of the new voluntary teachers etc. is obstacles met in this school. Therefore the teachers of the school requested one of the volunteers to take over one of the workshop groups instead of the teacher, but the DRC Advisor advised against this, as the Red Cross volunteers in general does not have any pedagogical background and cannot be considered suitable for implementation instead of teachers. A meeting with all the teachers of J / Myilliddy North Kalaimagal Vid. as well as the principal will be held after the school holidays to discuss possible solutions. The school is one of the weakest in the programme and has been severely affected by the war. The communities are still living displaced in IDP camps, as their original place of origin is part of one of the High Security Zones. It is therefore important to support this school as much as possible for them to continue with the programme.
