	<p>*Basic ward equipment such as dressing trolleys &amp; infusion stands have also been provided.</p> <p><b>Water &amp; Sanitation:</b></p> <p>*Within the 1<sup>st</sup> 2 weeks the ICRC water engineer team installed four 1000 litre water tanks &amp; 30 latrines in welfare centres.</p> <p>*Existing latrines were cleaned &amp; a vital hand pump near a camp was repaired.</p> <p>*In 8 of the newly set up transit camps the ICRC has finalized the installation of water distribution systems.</p> <p>*In &amp; around 5 camps the ICRC is cleaning existing wells &amp; digging new areas.</p> <p>*Provision of staff quarters to the hospital staff who lost their homes.</p> <p>*At the Puthiyakudiyiruppu Rural Hospital the ICRC has increased the water storage capacity with the installation of water bladder tanks.</p> <p>*Wash basins with access to running water &amp; to the sewage system have been put in place. A generator donated by the German Red Cross provides electricity to the operation theatre, the sterilization chamber &amp; the x-ray dept.</p> <p><b>Shelter:</b></p> <p>*ICRC provided over 2000 tarpaulin plastic sheets to families in welfare centres.</p> <p>*Installation of 560 family kits in the transit camps.</p> <p><b>Assistance:</b></p> <p>*Delivery of over 3700 family parcels containing essential households items.</p> <p>*11800 articles of clothing were provided to the displaced people.</p> <p>*125 Jerry cans,1400 kerosene lanterns &amp; 50 litre communal cooking pots were also distributed</p> <p>*The ICRC also provided mail kits to 2430 families containing envelopes,stamps,papers &amp; pens.</p> <p><b>Health:</b></p> <p>*Extended its work at the Pallai Divisional Hospital to include the Maruthankerny Rural Hospital.</p>		31/03/2005

	<p>Discussion will be held to distribute 520 tents to welfare centres.</p> <p><b>Shelter:</b>  *FO Kilinochchi continues to follow up with the task forces for information relating to families who are in need of tents.  *FO Kilinochchi also commenced NFRI distribution in the newly-opened transitional camps &amp; also to IDP families staying with friends &amp; relatives.</p> <p><b>Logistics:</b>  *3 March 2005,a consignment of 2314 plastic buckets could not be off loaded in Kilinochchi since LTTE would not agree to their distribution. They were sent to Jaffna &amp; the 1146 Galvanized Iron(GI) buckets from Jaffna were sent back to Kilinochchi in part exchange.</p> <p><b>Protection:</b>  *The plastic sheeting delivered to kallaru camp to enclose bathrooms has still not been erected.</p>		<p>03/03/2005</p> <p>17/03/2005</p>
UNICEF	<p>Two water bowsers to be dispatched to Kilinochchi/ Mullaitivu.  Construction of women’s private bathing areas in all camps in Mullaitivu &amp; Kilinochchi.  School cleaning in Mullaitivu &amp; Killinochchi.  A bathing area was completed at Ward 9 Uduthurai Transit Camp. Bathing areas have also been startd at Valtariya GS Division, Arasady and Varivadden. Ground water tanks have been completed in Sundibullam and Kalaru where some 90 families are expected to be housed in tents.  Building 17 bathing areas in transit camps – 4 sets have been completed and 4 started.  Members of the Mine Action Team have demined all transit centre sites.  School supplies have been distributed in 20 schools.  Construction of temporary school shelters is ongoing. UNICEF has also provided 145 tarpaulins and jungle poles for 8 schools – consisting of 40 temporary classrooms – where displaced families continue to occupy school buildings.  Three water tanks, buckets and plastic cups have been distributed to temporary schools.
