	<p>provided.</p> <p>Water & Sanitation:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> *Within the 1st 2 weeks the ICRC water engineer team installed four 1000 litre water tanks & 30 latrines in welfare centres. *Existing latrines were cleaned & a vital hand pump near a camp was repaired. *In 8 of the newly set up transit camps the ICRC has finalized the installation of water distribution systems. *In & around 5 camps the ICRC is cleaning existing wells & digging new areas. *Provision of staff quarters to the hospital staff who lost their homes. *At the Puthiyakudiyiruppu Rural Hospital the ICRC has increased the water storage capacity with the installation of water bladder tanks. *Wash basins with access to running water & to the sewage system have been put in place. A generator donated by the German Red Cross provides electricity to the operation theatre, the sterilization chamber & the x-ray dept. <p>Shelter:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> *ICRC provided over 2000 tarpaulin plastic sheets to families in welfare centres. *Installation of 560 family kits in the transit camps. <p>Assistance:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> *Delivery of over 3700 family parcels containing essential households items. *11800 articles of clothing were provided to the displaced people. *125 Jerry cans, 1400 kerosene lanterns & 50 litre communal cooking pots were also distributed *The ICRC also provided mail kits to 2430 families containing envelopes, stamps, papers & pens. <p>Health:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> *Extended its work at the Pallai Divisional Hospital to include the Maruthankerny Rural Hospital. <p>* Launched a rural well rehabilitation program in Kandawalai.</p>		<p>31/03/2005</p> <p>14/04/2005</p>

UNHCR	<p>300 UNHCR tents were delivered to Vanni. The Kilinochchi Government Agent (GA) has delivered 159 of this to Kallaru Transit Camp. Forty-nine families have already moved in to the “transition camp” at Kallaru.</p> <p>Discussion will be held to distribute 520 tents to welfare centres.</p> <p>Shelter:</p> <p>*FO Kilinochchi continues to follow up with the task forces for information relating to families who are in need of tents.</p> <p>*FO Kilinochchi also commenced NFRI distribution in the newly-opened transitional camps & also to IDP families staying with friends & relatives.</p> <p>Logistics:</p> <p>*3 March 2005, a consignment of 2314 plastic buckets could not be off loaded in Kilinochchi since LTTE would not agree to their distribution.
