CARE has held meetings with divisional leaders to coordinate rehabilitation phase and expects to work in Padavi Sri Pura, Trincomalee Town and Graveats, Kinniya, Muttur, and Echchilampattu (all seriously affected).</p> <p>CARE has distributed 1160 of the total 2500 NFIs in the Town &amp; Greavts DS. There has been a delay in the distribution of the final 1340 NFI packs due to disturbances in the town related to the equity of NFI distribution. CARE is coordinating with the DS to plan the final distribution.</p> <p>CARE successfully completed the NFRI distribution in Town and Gravets on 26 February. The remaining 135 NFRI kits will be distributed within 2 days. Cash for Work is being carried out in four villages in Eachchalampattu DS division in collaboration with the CBOs established under AFIDACAH (PRIDE) project. Further Cash for Work activities are planned for the immediate future in Kuchchaveli and Kinniya. Established two communication centers in Muduchennai and Eachchalampattu villages in collaboration with CBOs. The center in Muduchennai opened 20 February. There are plans to establish three more centers. Committed to at least 100 transitional shelter units in Kinniya DS division and 104 in Kuchcheveli DS division.</p> <p>Cash for Work is being carried out in four DS divisions: Kinniya, Eachchalampattu, Muthur, Kuchchaveli. Work in Kuchchaveli, Kinniya, and Muthur began this week. In each DS division, CARE is collaborating with CBOs. There are approximately 125 people working each day. CARE has committed to a total of 512 transitional shelter units (412 in Kucheveli and 100 in Kinniya). There are ongoing discussions with the GA to increase CARE's commitment upwards towards 1000 if there is demonstrated need in areas where CARE has committed to work. CARE has been finalizing the shelter plans to begin the procurement process. 	<p>Decided to send 12 volunteers on 10 days training in Jaffna in April. DRC interested in reconstruction of Kuchchaveli Hospital.</p> <p><b>2. Follow up/ supervision</b></p> <p>For the second time supervision and monitoring was given to each of the four groups. Bags, cups, T-shirts, pens, were provided to all volunteers and notebooks for some of them. One logbook provided to each of the welfare centres. Everybody was reminded of the importance of registering. Volunteers delivered their filled out registration forms and shared their experience of doing PSP. In general, volunteers were happy with the activities, children and parents approved of them and even some religious leaders as well. 2 – 3 volunteers will cover each of the selected welfare centres. The idea of establishing community centres was discussed. Volunteers will explore the situation in their welfare centres regarding that issue.</p> <p>Volunteers do PSP in the welfare centres for 12 half days pr. month. Still they can only be paid 150 Rs. per day and 1.800 Rs. at maximum per month. That means not more than 12 working days. It may be difficult to sustain the group of volunteers on only 150 Rs pr. day when other NGOs are paying more. Some of the volunteers have to LEGGJa hart ad ser f. ex. need to travel long distances, up to 15 km, to the welfare centres. A new policy from SLRCS HQ regarding this issue must be accepted soon and made official.</p> <p>It is very important to regularly follow up and monitor volunteer’s activities in the welfare centres. It has to be stated that volunteers are doing their expected activities, the quality of their work need to be ensured and supported and they have to experience interest and support from SLRCS and DRC.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Volunteers in Eachilampathu: 8 volunteers attended. Four volunteers did not come. Hopefully it was only because of they misunderstood the time of the meeting. Decided to work in 4 welfare centres where many lives were lost. Some of the welfare centres have 2 – 3 divisions in different places. Some volunteers keep the toys and items in locked places in ICRC’s health centres and others keep them at home.</li> </ul> <p>Information about a school which was washed away: Verugal Muhathuwaram. 33 people died. UNICEF provided temporary shelters. We have postponed the construction for a while and will meet InterSOS and Dr. Faiz, MoH in Muthur next Monday.</p> <p>4. <b>Task Force meeting of Education:</b> Different NGOs were participating and giving information about their activities. NRC has not received any confirmation allowing them to build and reconstruct many schools in three districts, incl. 1 in Trincomalee and 7 in Muthur. There is a possibility that DRC will participate in the reconstruction or the renovation of playgrounds. -InterSOS has provided temporary shelters for three schools in Muthur. -Exams have been postponed until June. Children lost their notes. They have now been copied and distributed. Special classes are preparing the pupils for the exams. -GTZ and UNICEF have been providing different items to schools. -WFP: Had a feeding program before Tsunami and still have. Need for kitchen utensils and kitchen in many schools. -IFRC/ Danish Red Cross can provide school items, bicycles for school children who have to travel more than 3 km to and from school, are Tsunami affected and are attending school. \* The ICRC has equipped four wells with concrete aprons for bathing purposes and plans improvements on other wells around the camp. At the ASC camp, one block of two latrines has been constructed and the existing well will be disinfected and improved.

\* A water treatment unit given to the ICRC by the Norwegian Red Cross has been installed at the Eachchilampatu Hospital and produces 15,000 litres of washing water per day.

### **Shelter**

The ICRC agreed to put up tents for all displaced families in Eachchilampattu, Mutur, Kuchchaveli town and gravets. About 1000+ tents have been set up so far in seven camps and other locations.

\*. An additional 79 tents have been distributed to displaced families in the area. Six temporary communal kitchens are under construction in three of the camps.
