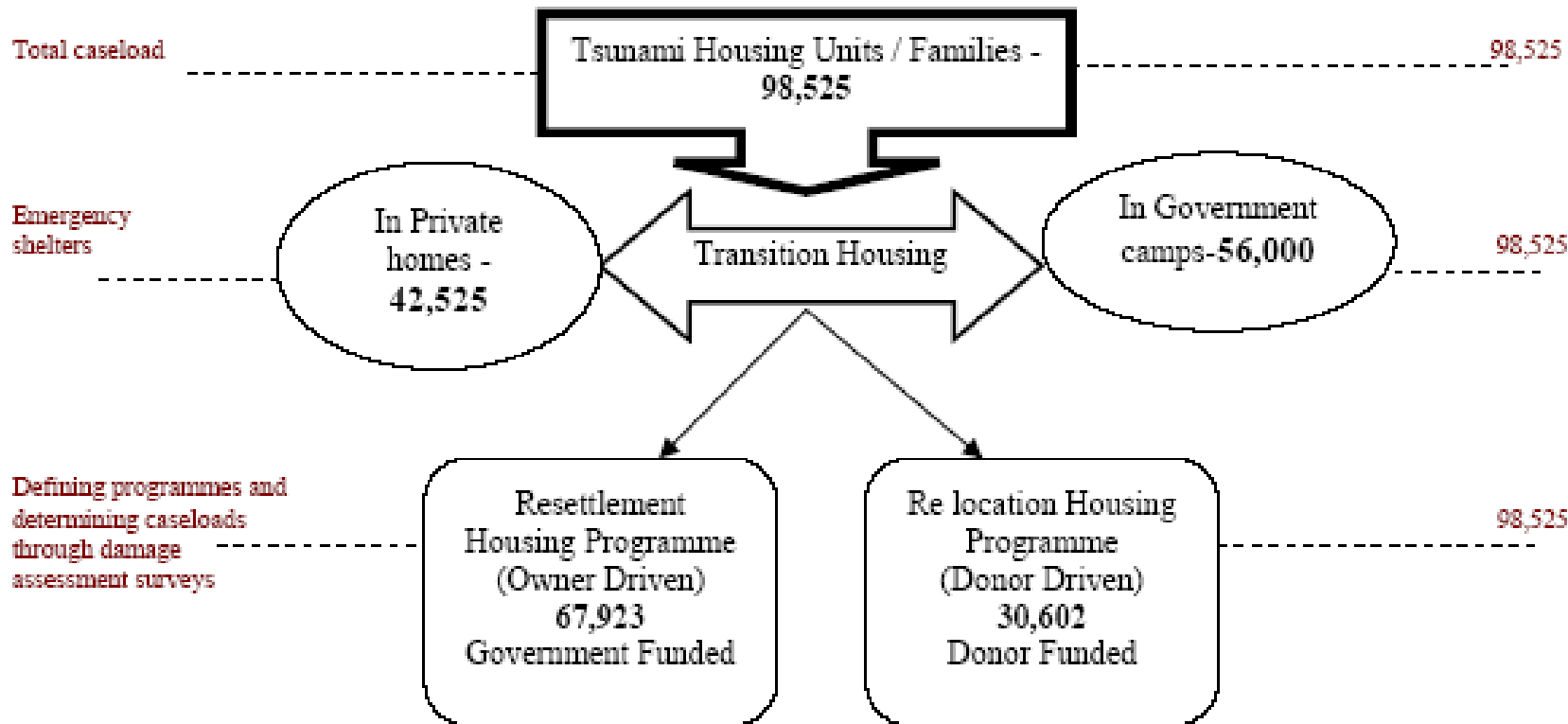
### Conclusions:

- (1) Exert international pressure in order to get authorities to disclose current findings
- (2) Insist that a thorough and transparent investigation is carried out into the incident
- (3) Widen scope of the HSSG to include incidents faced by other Humanitarian workers. To this end HSSG will take action taking the following into account:
  - Escalation of incidents of harassment and violence faced by aid workers
  - Advocating the need to ensure the safety of the lives of humanitarian personnel by the government, military, agency head offices etc.
  - Hold all relevant persons accountable for security lapses

# **Discussion on Tsunami progress based on RADA report**

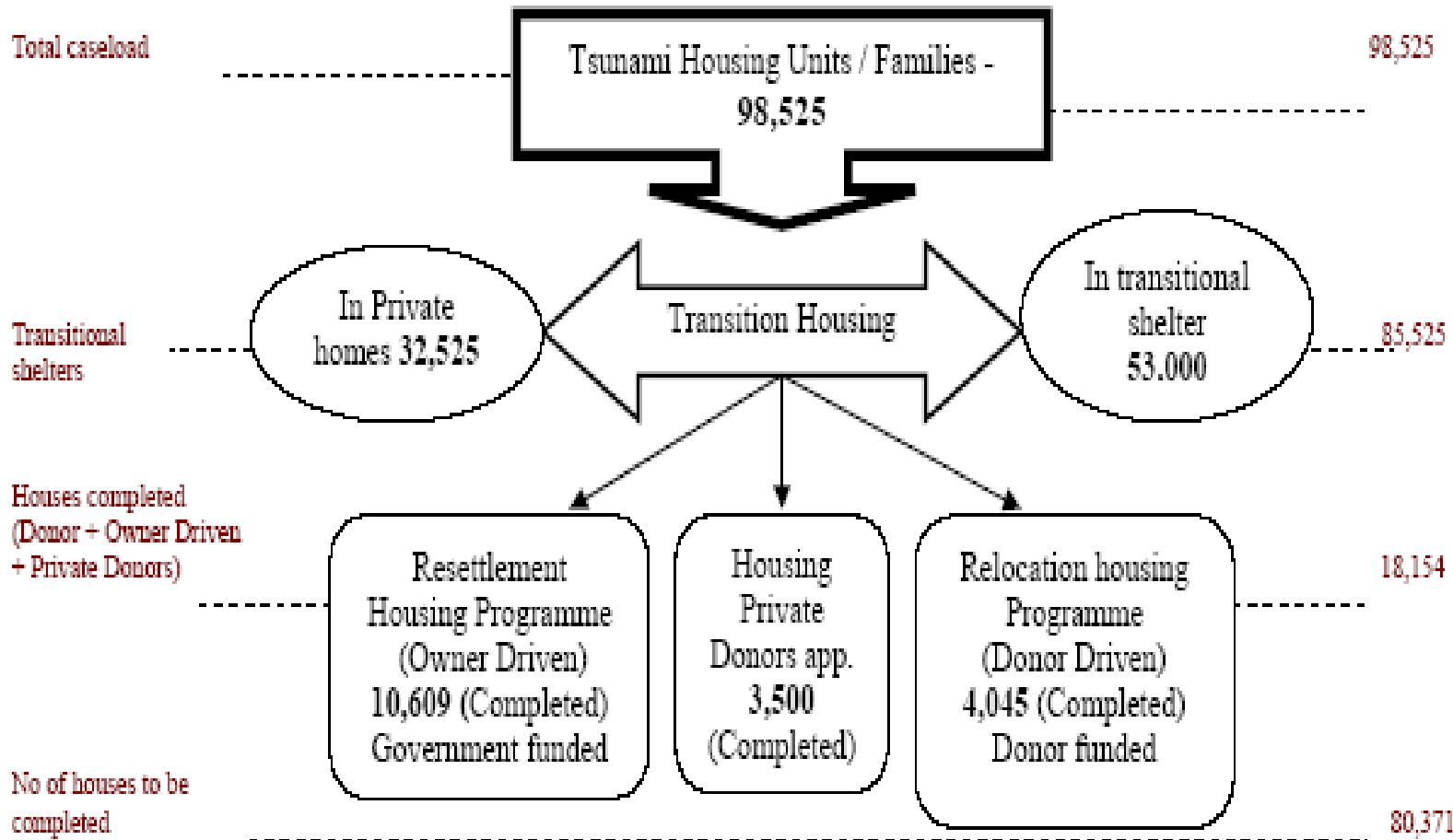
- **Housing Programme Summary**
- **Transitional Shelter**
- Towards December 2005, 56,000 Transitional Shelter units were completed.
- Of this, a total of 6,015 units have already been decommissioned.
- **Permanent Shelter**
- Previous target : 98,525
- New target: 120,000
- Completed - 55,483 permanent houses (56% of previous target) Under Construction – 40,589 Houses Completed and under construction represent 97% of previous target and 80% of current target

## TSUNAMI SHELTER PROGRAMME Snap Shot - January 2005



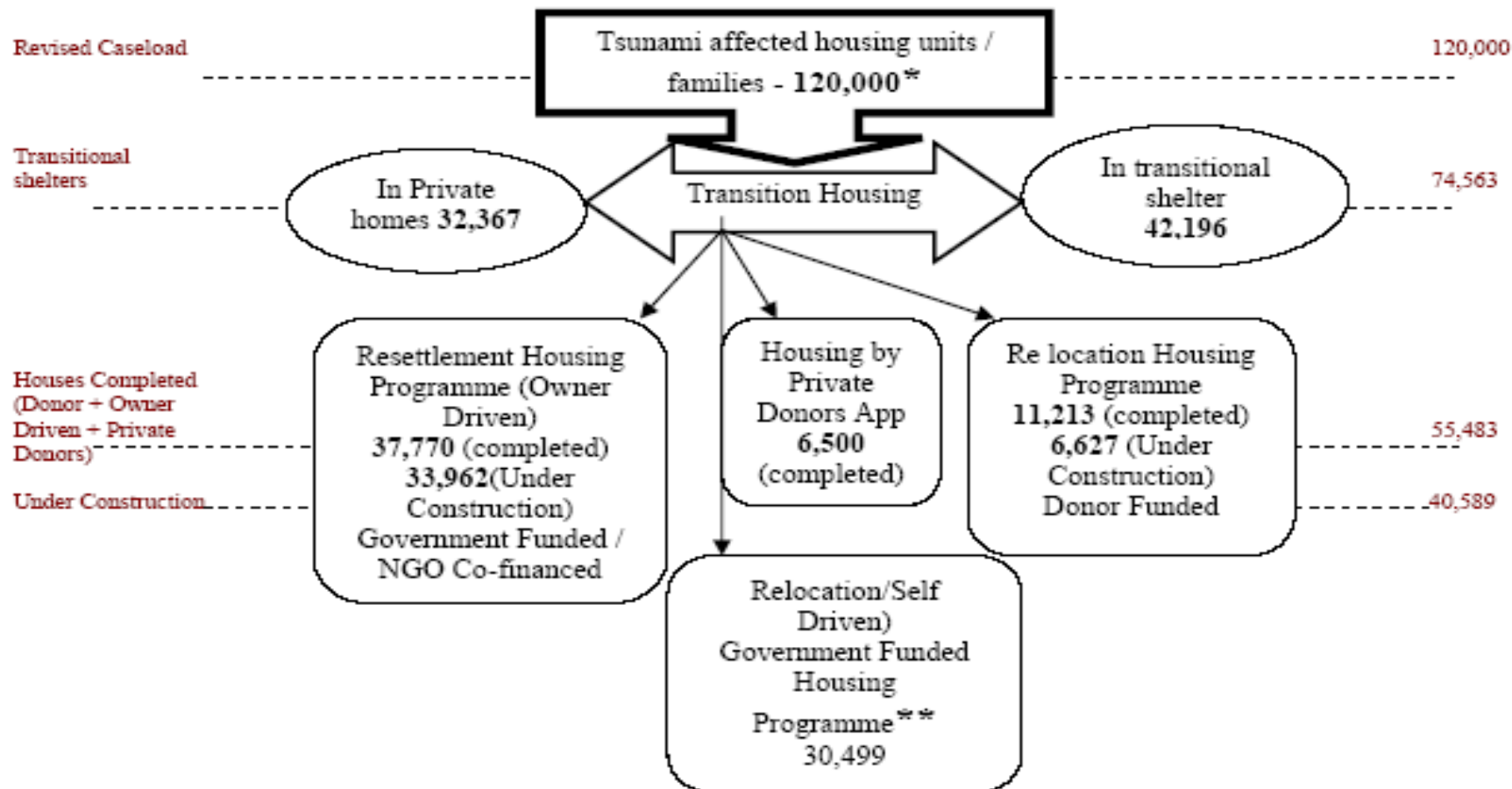

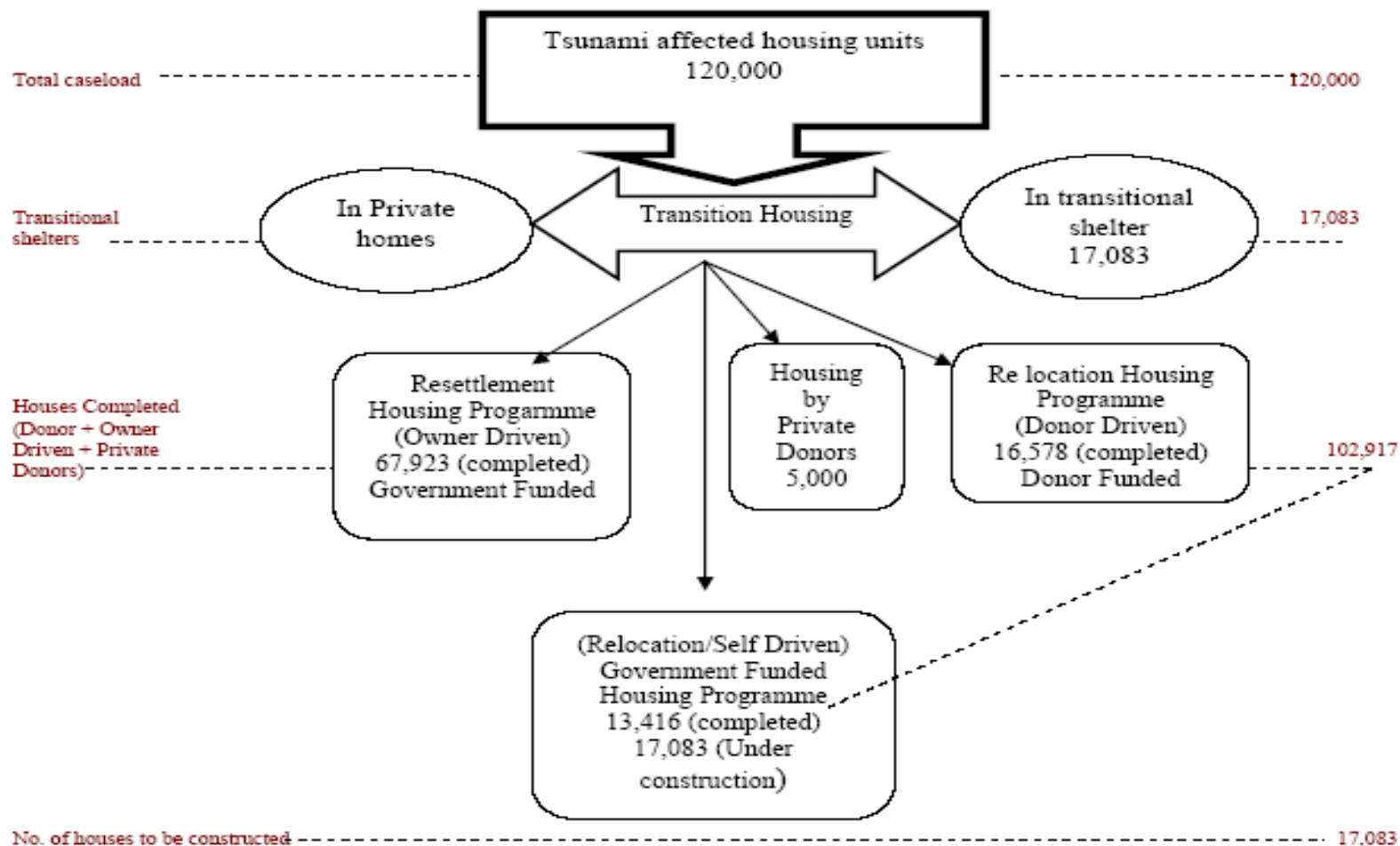
### Snap Shot June 2006 - Post Housing Policy Revision

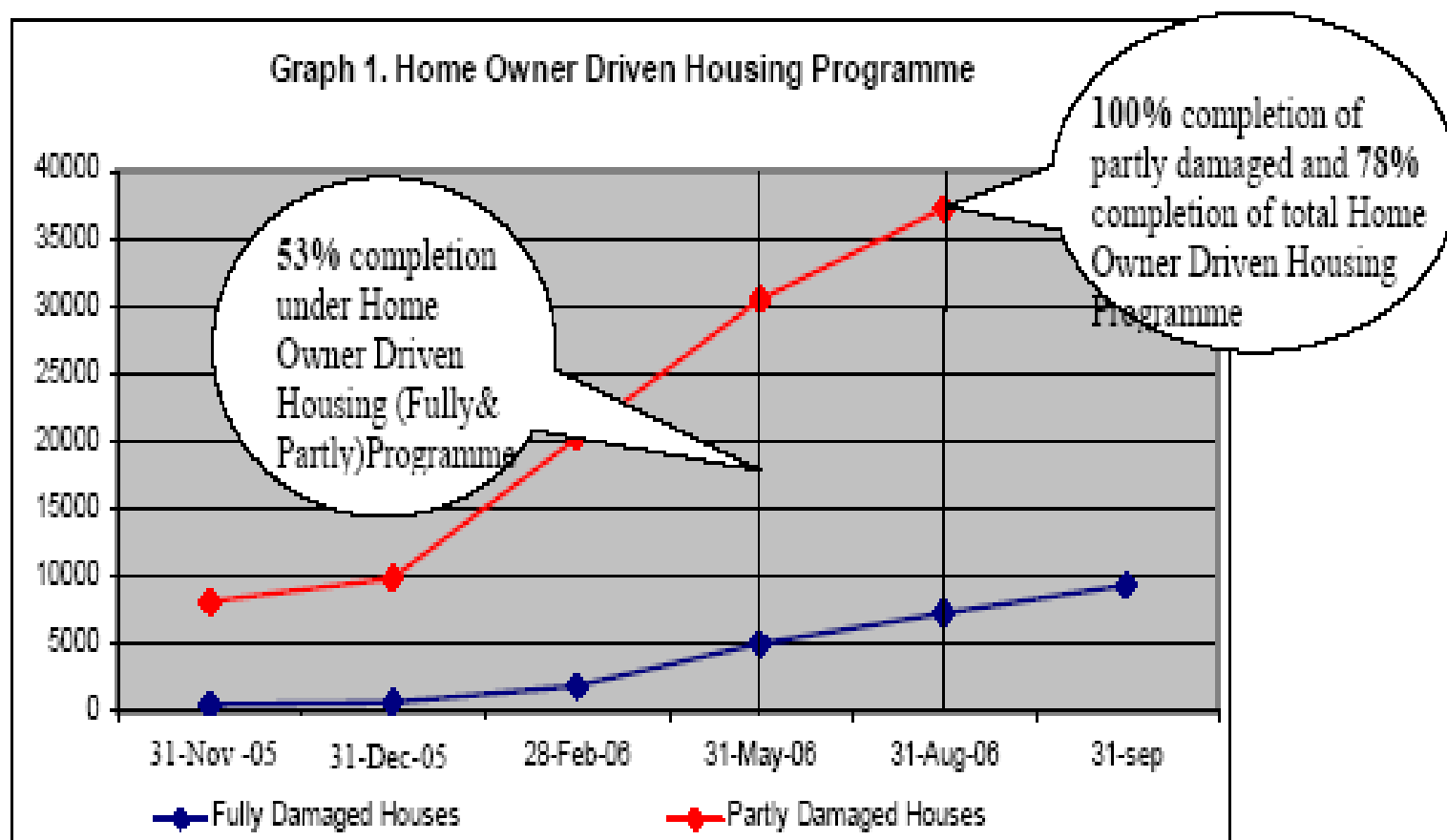

## TSUNAMI SHELTER PROGRAMME Snap Shot December 2006

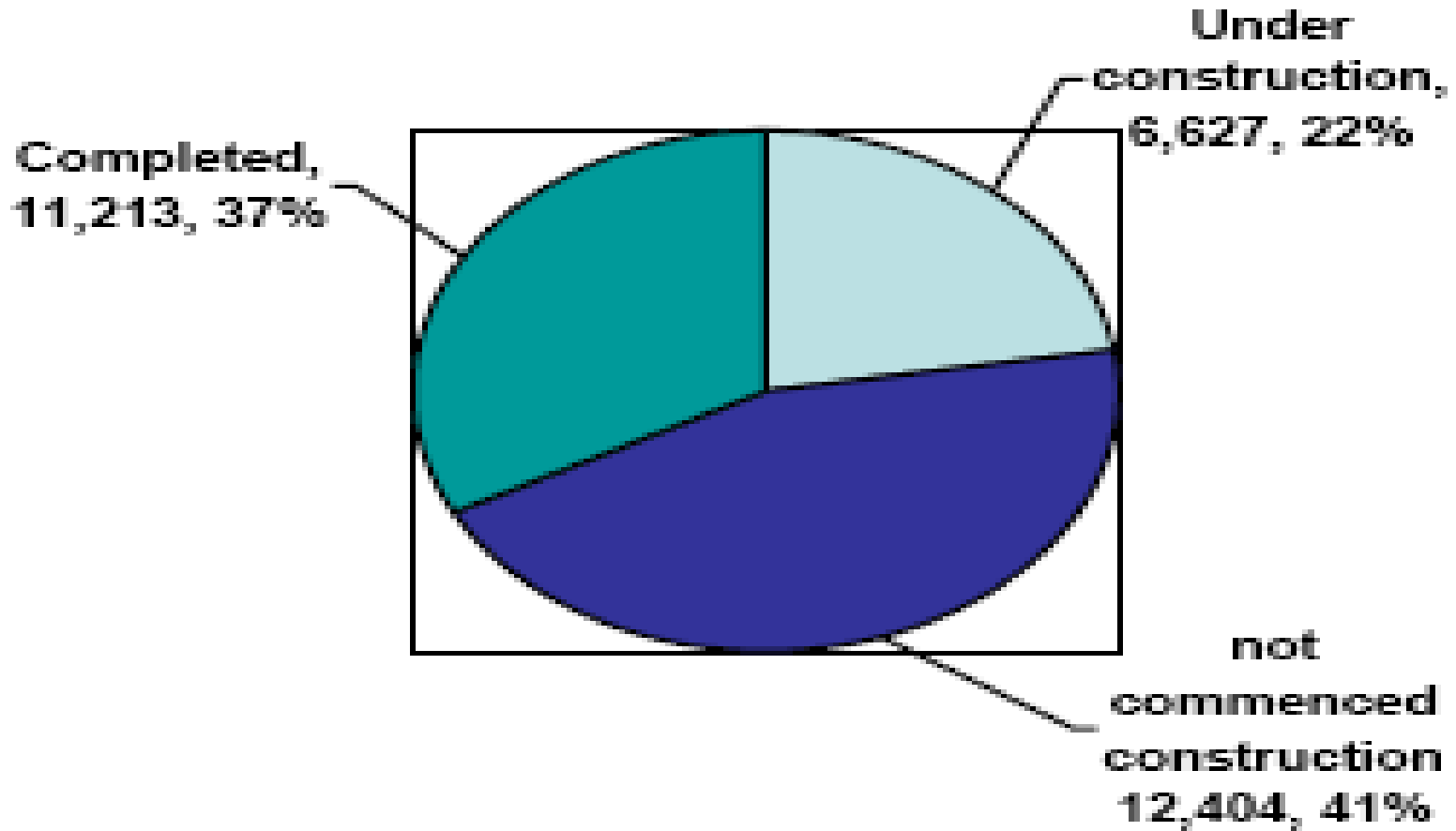


*Achievements:*

Home Owner Driven Programme-As of June 2006, 37,770 families have almost completed construction of their homes thereby meeting 53% of the target (71,732) under this programme.

## Livelihood Summary

- Target : 150,000 lost their livelihoods (50 % Fisheries, 45 % - Tourism, Small businesses, Trading, 5 % - Agriculture)
- 75 % of affected households have regained their main source of income (increase of 35% Since April 2005)
- 100% damaged boats repaired 95% destroyed boats replaced Production (fisheries) estimated at 70% of pre-tsunami levels

# Health and Education Summary

Targets:

- (4) Reconstruction/renovation of 182 schools, 4 universities, 7 vocational training authorities, 446 IDP schools
- (2) Reconstruction/renovation of 222 health institutions (104 damaged, 118 non-damaged)

Nearly 50% in progress or completed

- Total MoUs signed	173
- Total no. of Tsunami affected schools without donors	09

# Infrastructure Summary

## Water and Sanitation

### Targets:

- (1) Fulfill immediate needs by Feb 2005
- (2) Restore services to pre-tsunami levels by mid-2006
- (3) Expand service capacity to meet medium to long term needs by mid-2008

Restoration of essential infrastructure facilities that were

damaged/destroyed has been successfully completed  
130 water related projects planned Donors have  
committed funds for 96 projects, which are in progress

# Roads and Bridges

Targets: Rehabilitation of 1173 km of national roads and 25 major bridges

Roads: Two projects (Colombo-Galle-Wellawaya road and emergency repairs under STAART0 have commenced)

8 projects in tendering stage

Bridges : 4 have commenced construction, 10 in tendering process, designs completed for 5

## Power and Energy

Targets:

Phase I : covering supply of electricity to temporary settlement camps, replacing damaged network, providing supply to all relocated families  
Phase II: Network development to cater for new load that will come up with new infrastructure development  
Phase III: Focus on additional infrastructure catering to Long term (10-15 years)

Electricity supplied to most temporary settlement camps.

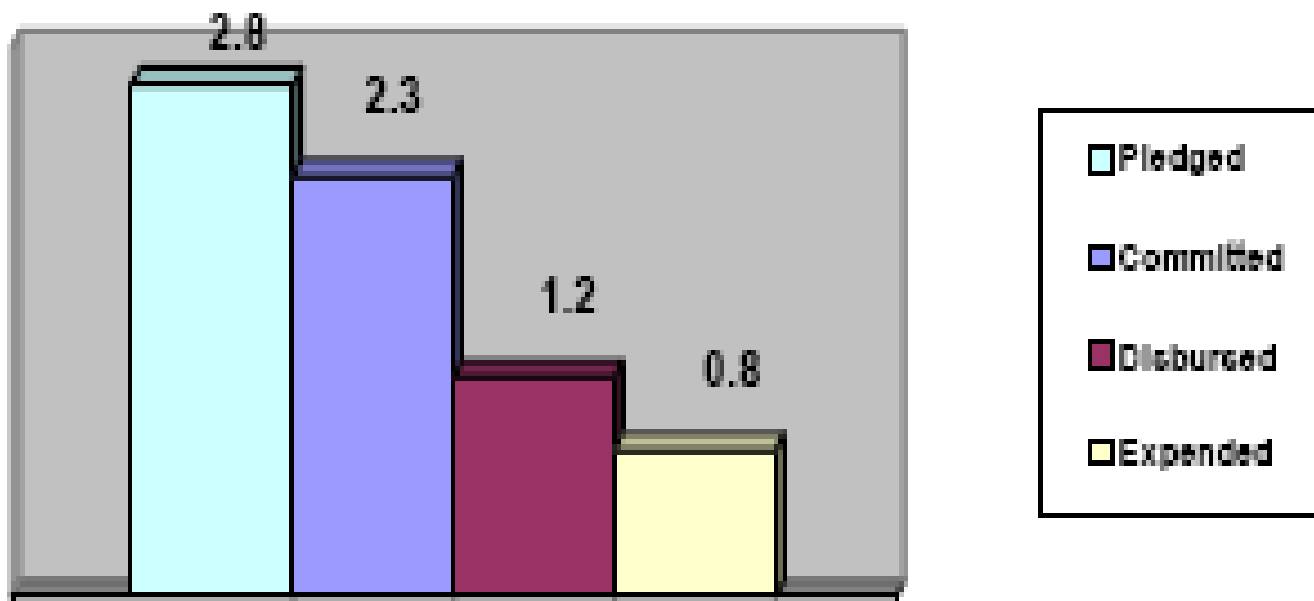
Damaged network replaced

Almost all relocated families have access to electricity
