Matara	- Oxfam and World Vision plan to purchase a land to install a sewage treatment plant for Matara if the water board permits it. It is decided to arrange a meeting with Oxfam, World Vision, GA, Water board & CHA to discuss issues arising about land ownership.
Galle	<p>- World Vision has started 40 water irrigation projects for canals passing to the sea. This is to remove sand brought by Tsunami, which blocks the opening to sea. Already 2 of these projects are completed and 7 are on the process.</p> <p>- ITDG, which is involved in livelihood, WATSAN and solid waste management, does waste management activities in Matara. They have been given the consent to operate in Galle as well.</p> <p>DS wants to organize a workshop to educate people on how to prevent a fire caused by electricity, gas and petrol. As they are living in wooden T/S now they are quite vulnerable to these types of dangers which they don't know how to handle</p>

District	Issue
Galle	- In Dadalla west GN Division there are about 10 people who do not have even a transitional shelter. These people still live in their own partially damaged houses very close to the sea. But in this rainy period it is dangerous in living those places as the walls are not strong. Eventhough they do not have transitional shelters their names are included in the permananant housing list. They have made appeals for T/S. But no response has been received yet.
